



The Five Work Comp Errors EVERY Agent Makes

Workers' compensation, as a coverage, is simple. A worker gets hurt, the work comp policy pays – theoretically; that's the simple part. The more complicated areas of workers' compensation involve the state laws and legal doctrines applicable to workers' comp. Key areas of confusion are:

1. For whom is the insured actually responsible under workers' comp laws?

4. When should insured's experience mod be combined?
5. What are some of the key premium audit problems?
